- To prepare ALL students for success at KS3, KS4, KS5 and Higher Education.

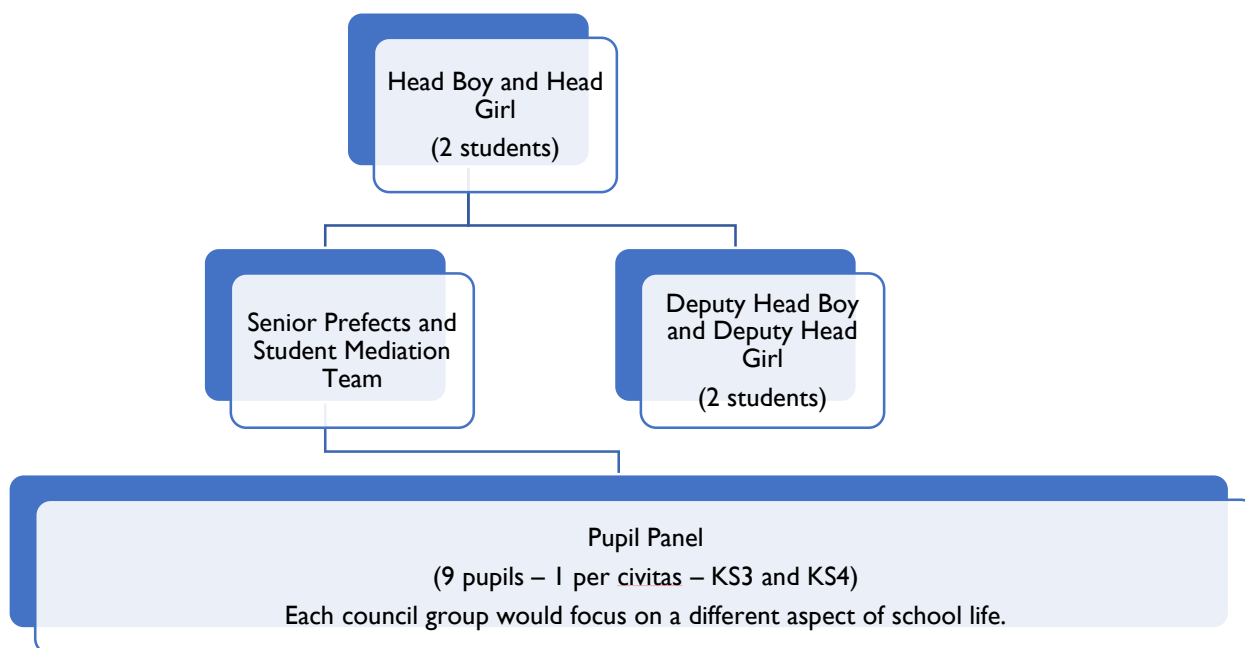
What does Bolingbroke Academy Student Leadership involve?

- Processes and structures for pupil and student representation and the incorporation of pupils' and students' views into decision making in the life of the school.

How can pupils and students gain positions within the formal leadership structure?

- Complete an expression of interest to be a member of the Pupil Panel or a member of the Senior Senate (Senior Prefect).
- The roles of Head Boy, Head Girl, Deputy Head Boy and Deputy Head Girl will be elected at the end of Spring 1 of Year 12. Students will assume these positions and carry out key duties and responsibilities until Spring 1 of Year 13.
